Noted Author Eliza Griswold has been appointed the 2011 Everding Distinguished Lecturer in Anglican and Interreligious Affairs by Iliff School of Theology and Saint John's Episcopal Cathedral. Ms. Griswold is the author of *The Tenth Parallel*, in which she explores the knife-edge where Islam and Christianity meet.

Eliza Griswold has spent much of the past seven years traveling in Africa and Asia between the equator and the line of latitude seven hundred miles to the north, the tenth parallel. Through a series of unforgettable characters and their lives of deep faith, she tells the fifteen-hundred year story of how these two great faiths have come to intersect—and interact. She concludes that the most important forces shaping the future of the world's religions are those contests unfolding inside of Christianity and Islam, not between them. She shows us that religion, like the weather, links us to each other whether we like it or not.
